

Meredith Blount Miller, M.S. is a Conservation Specialist at the River Systems Institute at Texas State University where she is involved in multiple water management and conservation projects, including a Global Environment Facility and United Nations Environment Programme funded bi-national management plan for the Rio Grande River basin and the USDA's Rio Grande Sustainable Agricultural Water Conservation Initiative. She was recently a leading contributor in the submission of the Rio Grande River for consideration of the America's Great Waters Coalition, which was approved in December of 2010, making the Rio Grande one of the newest recognized "America's Great Waters". Her previous and ongoing research includes regional water conservation assessment and ecosystem valuation studies and endangered species habitat requirement studies.
