Why establish Marine Protected Areas in California and what is the GOAL?



Marine Life Protection Act



Enacted in 1999 - California state law that requires establishment of a network of Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) along the California Coast.



GOALS:

1. Protect the natural diversity and abundance of marine life.
2. Help sustain, conserve and protect marine life populations, including those of economic value and rebuild those that are depleted.
3. Improve recreational, educational and study opportunities provided by marine ecosystems.

4. Protect marine natural heritage.

5. Ensure California's MPAs have clearly defined objectives, effective mgmt. measures and adequate enforcement and are based on sound scientific guidelines.

6. Ensure the State's MPAs are designed and managed, to the extent possible, as a network.

- 2008: MLPA process started in Southern CA
- 2012: MPAs implemented in Southern CA
- Public/private partnership



Southern California State and Federal Marine Protected Areas




Tijuana River Mouth State Marine Conservation Area

- Allowed Species (commercial): Coastal pelagic species, except market squid by round haul net.

Conserving California's Coastal Treasures

Marine Protected Areas Safeguard Our Ocean's Bounty

A statewide network of Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) safeguards California's rich coastal resources. Beneath the surface of Año Nuevo and Greyhound Rock MPAs, towering kelp forests shelter vibrant sea stars, creeping abalone, and colorful rockfishes. Pelicans and gulls soar above the waves. Listen for the deep roar of bull elephant seals from the large breeding colony that visits here each year.

MPA Regulations

- Año Nuevo State Marine Conservation Area (SMCA)**
No recreational fishing or take allowed. Allows commercial take of kelp by hand.
- Greyhound Rock State Marine Conservation Area (SMCA)**
Allows recreational and commercial take of giant kelp by hand, squid, and salmon. Recreational fishing by hook and line from shore only.
